The Global Triangular Cooperation Ecosystem and the Role of MÁS QUE TRES

The design of MÁS QUE TRES, during its initial concept phase, was informed by an analysis of spaces aimed at fostering dialogue, concept development, capacity building, and knowledge sharing in global Triangular Cooperation (TC). This analysis focused on bilateral, regional, and international initiatives in which Ibero-American countries have participated.

While the global ecosystem of actors and initiatives is broader, this snapshot emphasizes those with strong ties to the region. These include Germany, Japan, the European Union, the Global Partnership Initiative (GPI) on Effective Triangular Cooperation, the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), the Ibero-American General Secretariat (SEGIB), and the United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC). Each was examined regarding project support, training opportunities, dialogue platforms, knowledge generation, TC management tools, and organizational strengthening.

The development of MÁS QUE TRES coincided with Brazil's G20 presidency and the VII Regional Conference on Trilateral Cooperation with Latin America and the Caribbean (May 2024, Salvador de Bahía, Brazil). It also overlapped with preparations for the 8th International Meeting on Triangular Cooperation (October 2024, Lisbon, Portugal).

This analysis uncovered numerous opportunities for experience exchange, as well as key differences between initiatives, potential connections, risks of duplication, and gaps in the TC ecosystem. Based on these insights, MÁS QUE TRES aims to offer a unique contribution as a space for technical collaboration, built by a diverse group of countries that play different roles in TC. In line with the principles of TC, its value lies in connecting actors, initiatives, resources, and knowledge. With an agile, horizontal, and flexible approach, MÁS QUE TRES is well-positioned to facilitate the co-creation of innovative solutions, fostering experience-sharing, mutual learning, and bridging the technical and strategic levels.

Ongoing Reflection

This mapping can be expanded and updated as new initiatives emerge and evolve, contributing to the global development and strengthening of TC as a tool for sustainable development.
